The programs offered under vocational opportunities are as follows:

Child Development – Students learn about becoming a child development teacher. Admission criteria are as follows-signing up through guidance counselor.

Child Development Lab-Requires completion of Child Development or Psychology. Students work in live child Development Program for preschool children ages 3,4 and 5. Admission Criteria is stated above.

Child Development Seminar-Students obtain opportunity to teach in Nursery School and out in the field in the course of study. Admission criteria are as follows: must have completed Child Development Lab.

Introduction to Networking-students will obtain the basic knowledge required to successfully network a small group of computers and related equipment. Students will utilize a fully integrated networking laboratory including wireless capabilities. Admission criteria are as follows-signing up through guidance counselor.
